


All Campus Sing

One of the most attended events at Murray State is All Campus Sing. Since 1958, members of the women's music fraternity, Sigma Alpha Iota, have conducted the event, where student groups compete with choreographed musical numbers on the steps of Lovett Auditorium. The competition includes four categories: sororities, fraternities, residential and independent.

Each year, spectators set up in the Quad to watch the festivities. All Campus Sing is not just a day of entertainment: proceeds from this tradition support music programs for schools in underprivileged communities.





Ms. Murray State

The Ms. Murray State Pageant is an annual competition that takes place in Lovett Auditorium, and the competition serves to celebrate more than pageantry.

The pageant serves to recognize students who are influential and have a positive impact on Murray State.

The winner of the pageant receives a scholarship and represents Murray State in the Kentucky Mountain Laurel Festival. The winner of the 2022 Ms. Murray State Pageant was Junior Hanan Stiff.

Almost Midnight Breakfast

A comparatively new tradition, Almost Midnight Breakfast in Winslow Dining Hall helps students destress on the night before Finals Week every semester.

Since 1991, thousands of students have gathered to enjoy breakfast staples like scrambled eggs, pancakes, bacon, hash browns and more. Faculty and staff volunteers hand out meals and encourage students as they prepare for their exams.



Shoe Tree

Believed to have begun around 1965, the Shoe Tree commemorates couples who met at Murray State. Each "sole" mate hangs one of their shoes to the tree, and those who have started families traditionally add a baby shoe.

Two trees have preceded the current Shoe Tree. The first was struck by lightning, and the second had broken limbs.

While it is unknown how this tradition began, it remains cherished at Murray State. The tree has caught outside attention too: in 2018, the Danish music group Lukas Graham featured it in their "Love Someone" video.

Mr.MSU

The Mr. Murray State pageant is a 42-year standing tradition. The pageant is hosted by Alpha Omicron Pi, and it is their biggest philanthropy event.

Fraternities nominate their candidates for the pageant, and there is usually a theme for the contestants to follow. The most recent pageant was help on Oct. 1, 2022, during Family Weekend.



Racer One

Since 1976, Murray State football spectators have celebrated touchdowns by watching a thoroughbred horse run a lap around the Roy Stewart Stadium track. The horse, which fans call "Racer One," has actually been several horses over the years.

Every year, a different horse usually takes on the role of Racer One and is guided by a student jockey. Violet Cactus, the first horse to perform these duties, was buried in 1984 near the spot where Racer One begins each victory lap.

Tent City

While Homecoming remains a staple at universities across the country, Tent City makes Murray State's celebration different. Each fall, campus organizations set up around 50 tents altogether at Roy Stewart Stadium. Students and alumni alike partake in the tailgating festivities before the Homecoming football game.

The homecoming parade allows campus organizations to showcase their creativity through handcrafted floats. Murray State selects a new alum each year to serve as grand marshal. The parade, which involves children from the surrounding community, also features Racer One and the awardwinning Racer Band.

Campus Lights

Another annual campus tradition, Campus Lights, is the longest-running student-produced musical in the South. Since 1938, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, the men's music fraternity, has hosted musicals like "The Music Man," "Bye Bye Birdie," "Godspell" and more. Now a collaboration with women's music fraternity, Sigma Alpha Iota, Campus Lights raises money for scholarships in the Department of Music.

Every April since 1958, except for 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, student groups perform song, dance and skit performances on the steps of Lovett Auditorium. Beyond putting on a show for the Murray community, the event, hosted by women's music fraternity, Sigma Alpha Iota, also serves to donate to their philanthropy, People to People.

People to People donates instruments to schools in

nearly 60 countries.

Sigma Alpha Iota President Lucy Wilkinson said she is happy to see ACS back to its normal format.

"I would describe Sigma Alpha Iota's All Campus Sing as an event that is an experience like no other," Wilkinson said. "Being able to see organizations all across campus come together to share music is a truly inspirational thing."

The 2023 ACS took place on April 13. Before this ACS, a majority of students hadn't experienced a normal ACS. In 2020, ACS was canceled as students were sent home in the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic. And

in 2021, ACS was hosted remotely through a YouTube livestream, only allowing up to three performers at a time.

ACS Chair Addi Bussen said she was happy to see an important piece of Murray State tradition come back.

"For ACS last year we at

least wanted to have something that people could get involved with, because I feel like there was a weird lack of spirit," Bussen said. "This year since we are back to normal there will be a lot more involvement."

Rusty Jones, chair of the English Department, and Leigh Landini Wright, associate professor of journalism, were named Best Faculty Members in the 2023 Best of Murray survey. Jones began his teaching career in 2001, after he was accepted to graduate school in 1997. Jones' main focus in teaching is on Shakespeare and satire, something he relied on during his standup comedy stint from 2000-2004.

"I have always loved Shakespeare, it just came naturally, to bring all these things together," Jones said. "The satire thing came from my experiences as a comedian, where I would use comedy and the public venue or the public forum to attack things in society that I didn't like, and that personal experience led me in that direction."

Jones said working with students is what he enjoys most as a professor.

"I love watching them grow. I love watching them become excited about various topics," Jones said. "To be able to help support and guide them as they follow the areas in literature, creative writing, professional writing, philosophy and all the different programs that we deal with to help guide them toward what they find fascinating, is really exciting."

Jones said he feels grateful to have

been named best faculty by students.

"I feel ritually undeserving on

the one hand and deeply grate-

ful on the other because if I have a good reputation with students, the university and that's reflected by them voting for me, I guess all I can say is, 'thank you," Jones said.

Wright, a Murray State alumna, began teaching in 2010 after working as a journalist in western Kentucky for 16 years.

Wright said she loves journalism and enjoys getting to see students gain confidence in her classes.

"I really enjoy those 'light bulb moments' and enjoy the interaction with students," Wright said. "Just seeing them grow from new reporters that aren't confident that they can go out and do this to where they're going out, and they're doing interviews in a community that they don't even know that they didn't know existed until the class."

Of her classes, Wright said she enjoys teaching her JMC 597 capstone course because it allows her to see the growth students have made in the program.

"For the past year, we have been

focusing on the rebuilding and recovery efforts in Mayfield and now Marshall County," Wright said. "This way, I'm giving students real world experience that they can take with them when they graduate."

Wright said she was surprised to learn she was named best faculty member by students.

"It's a big honor to be voted as the best faculty member for *The Murray State News* 'Best of Edition,' because that's an award voted on by students," Wright said. "I was surprised, just very, very surprised, and very honored."

Wright said it's important for her students to know that she cares about their development in the department.

"I think the thing in JMC is that students often call me the JMC mom," Wright said. "I really hope that I can be that mom for some of my students, as they come to college, and they need someone to talk to and someone to help guide them to the rest of their careers."

A guide to Murray State sports

When students go off to college, a question they may ask is "how are the sports at my school?" At Murray State University, students can expect to see some great athletes across multiple sports, both men's and women's.

Murray State has 15 sports on campus; six men's sports and nine women's sports. There's plenty of action across all sports throughout the entire school year.

Fall

Starting in the fall, students can take in sports like men's and women's cross country, as well as football, soccer and volleyball.

While the cross country teams travel all season long, the football team plays its games at Roy Stewart Stadium, otherwise known as "the Stew" on social media.

This season, the football team opens its season with its 1,000th game that will be played at home against Presbyterian College on Saturday, Sept. 2. Though the team only has five games at home this season, each of those games is special in its own right, including this year's Homecoming game against Southern Illinois University on Saturday, Oct. 14.

The soccer team plays its games at Cutchin Field, located next to the Curris Center. The team has been competitive over the past few seasons, making it all the way to the MVC championship game in 2022.

The volleyball team has also been competitive in recent history, despite a first round exit in the 2022 MVC tournament. Their games are held in Racer Arena, located on the east side of Carr Health on campus. Around since 1954, Racer Arena was once home to the basketball team.

There are other sports that start in the fall and continue year round, including men's and women's golf and rifle.

Both golf teams travel year round but when they are at home, they play at Miller Memorial Golf Course.


The rifle team, which has won the OVC conference 17 times and made the national championships 35 times (eight times in the last nine seasons), hosts their matches over at Pat Spurgin Rifle Range, located inside Roy Stewart Stadium.











Winter

When winter comes around, it's time for the biggest sport at Murray State: basketball.

Both the men's and women's teams play at the CFSB Center, which was used in 2010 to host games for the NCAA Tournament (affectionately known as "March Madness").

The women's team had plenty of great seasons over the years. With Head Coach Rechelle Turner, formally a head coach at Murray High School, at the helm, the team expects success for years to come.

On the men's side, the team has seen great success in recent seasons, and has sent many players to the NBA over the season. At the games, they always make sure the fans know it is "the greatest tradition in the conference."

In 2022, the men's team made its way to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Round of 32 before being eliminated by St. Peters University. In 2023, the Racers came up short, losing in the quarterfinal round of the MVC tournament.

Spring
Once Spring rolls around,

Once Spring rolls around, there's still plenty of sports to watch, including track and field, baseball, softball, tennis. Other sports like golf and rifle also finish play in the springtime.

Marshall Gage Track is the home to the track and field team, and surrounds the football field with multiple events. Just next to Roy Stewart Stadium, you can find Johnny Reagan field, home to the baseball team, and Racer Field, home to the softball team.

For the tennis team, they host matches, both singles and doubles, at the Bennie Purcell Tennis Courts right next to Cutchin Field.

Sports go on year round at Murray State and there is always plenty to take in. Whether you're an avid fan of the sport, wanting to see the historic festivities, or just curious about what goes on at a Murray State sporting event, you can always find something to experience.

Parking on campus

What you need to know

Individuals parking on Murray State's campus will need to register their vehicle with a virtual permit from Murray State Parking Services.

The V-permit is registered to the license plate of the vehicle one parks on campus. Each registration is valid through a full fall, spring and summer semester.

This process can be completed at murraystate.nupark.com/portal/Account/Login with the following information: your name, Murray State ID or driver's license, local address, vehicle year, make, model and color, license plate number and the state and county in which the vehicle is registered.

Parking areas at Murray State are color-coded. A red permit is \$200 and is available for commuters and residents of White and Regents residential colleges.

A yellow permit is also \$200 and available for students who are residents of Elizabeth, HC Franklin, Clark, Richmond, Hart and Hester colleges. A purple permit is \$100 and available to all students, faculty and staff. A blue permit is \$200 and only available to faculty and staff. Parking citations range from \$15 to \$250. Violations that result in a \$15 fine include: parking in the wrong zone, parking beyond a space's time limit and improper parking, such as backing in or pulling through a space. \$80 citations include parking a vehicle in a way that obstructs traffic or parking in places other than designated parking spaces. A non-visitor parking in a visitor zone will result in a \$90 citation.

Non-registration or false registration of a vehicle, parking in reserved or restricted spaces and parking in a fire lane are \$100 citations. Parking in a disability space without permission will result in a \$250 citation.

Citations can be viewed and paid through a students' Ebill on their MyGate.

A majority of these violations are eligible for the Pay It Forward program, which benefits the Racers Helping Racers food pantry. Instead of paying the fine, students can donate food or hygiene products to the pantry within 30 days of the citation.
